### MEETING OF THE CRESCENT COMMUNITY ADVISORY COUNCIL (CCAC)

Chair Mary Bower called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m., Wednesday, November 10, 2021. Also present were Jon Cash, Terry Barnett and Connie Beauvais. CCAC Members appeared by either video or audio. David Bringham, Margaret Owens, Kaya Reynolds were absent. Guests were Commissioner Bill Peach, Chief Greg Waters, and Jeff Lewis.

Bill – The County faces the issue of people offering camping without compliance with Ordinances.

- It is not the intent of the County to create homelessness.
- Hopefully new Ordinances will provide relief to the Community.

##### b. Discussion on Campgrounds in Rural Areas

Connie – Bill touched on this issue, but "encampments" are a different issue.

Regarding campgrounds, we need to update zoning requirements. In Joyce there are plans for various campgrounds.

What does our rural community want to look at? Campsites per acre?

Jon – Ordinances regarding Water? Refuse Collection? Restrooms?

Connie – Residents have the right to enjoyment of their property.

Issues: Noise, lights, ingress and egress to property.

Bill – Clallam County has no "Nuisance Ordinance". Four complains triggers attention by County. No state laws for lights. The County has no "laundry list" of nuisances. A hearing Examiner can listen to all parties.

Mary – Chief Waters, do you have ideas of public safety issues:

- o Do not like us there
- o Drugs involved – substance abuse
- o Sanitation issues
- o Hard to treat people in areas
- o We do see children, but do not have a count
- o Not enough available law enforcement

Chlorine gas is now 2 ½ x the previous price. Problems at processing plants: fires, explosions.  
¾ of plants closed down.

- Diatomaceous earth.
- Orders are "18 weeks out".
- Costs more than doubled.
- Federal infrastructure money for drinking water will come in.
- Many new members are coming in with the influx of people to our area.
- Some industries with big water needs are looking to the Joyce area.
- \$1,900 fee added to members fees.
- There will be Monthly rate increase in the next few months.
- If there is no chlorine in the future, "ozonation" may be looked at.
- We do have some of the best water in the Country.

Chief Waters – Our Fire Commissioners received the 1<sup>st</sup> place Management Excellence Award. The Annual Awards Banquet will be January 15 at the Grange, but to avoid overcrowding, will not be open to the public.
