Hello Mr. Crawford,

Thanks for the response. I am adamant that the only chance to significantly raise the Chinook and Coho numbers is to add Bear Creek to the Dungeness flow to sustain the year-round tributary habitat for Chinook and Coho. This policy also needs the extra length to the river and slowing of the flow caused by the Jimmycomelately fixed exaggerated coil. This is a hybrid Jimmycomelately project which aims to increase Chum, Chinook and Coho populations in a rain shadow. Despite the alterations, there would be plenty of room for open spaces and parks. The only real casualty would be the reservoir. That would be replaced by smaller baffle projects along the Dungeness to filter large alluvium and the new Bear creek supported year round side channels added to the Jimmycomelately fixed meandering coil.

All is not lost for the reservoir project, as the hybrid Jimmycomelately project would not be a viable option without acquiring the space to do it in. Its just a better use of the land we now have acquired. I have offered to volunteer at multiple county government spots to give more feed back and give the hybrid Jimmycomelately a fair run up the flagpole. I am a fierce defender of this policy and I would champion the project well. For insurance reason alone, the Jimmycomelately hybrid should be considered.

directly involved with the Dungeness River Habitat Restoration or Off-Channel Reservoir Project, I want you to know how much I value your insights on these important matters.

I'd like to clarify that the Dungeness Trails County Park Trail System has been in place for many years, thanks to the dedicated efforts of local equestrian and cycling volunteers who collaborated with the State of Washington Department of Natural Resources (DNR) during its development some decades ago. Clallam County has proudly adopted this trail system, and currently, we do not plan to alter the park trails unless necessary for future habitat restoration projects. Our current priority is to enhance public safety for all users—motorists, pedestrians, cyclists, and equestrians—especially along River & Happy Valley Roads. Our county Parks and Roads Departments will work together on these efforts, which we anticipate will remain stable despite any future habitat restoration activities.

Hybrid Restoration Vision: Jimmycomelately-Style Main Channel + Bear Creek Diversion for Side Channels on the Dungeness

Your concept is a smart, tailored hybrid that combines the proven strengths of Jimmycomelately Creek with the specific needs of the Dungeness River's multi-species salmon runs.

Core Elements of the Hybrid Approach

1. Jimmycomelately Main-Channel Component

- Realign the lower Dungeness into a more natural, exaggerated meandering coil (as in Jimmycomelately).
- Add large woody debris for deep pools, slower velocities, and adult holding/spawning habitat.
- Plant dense riparian corridors with tall conifers for long-term shade, temperature control, and future wood recruitment. This provides the foundational slow, deep mainstem water and estuarine transition that worked so well for summer chum.

2. Bear Creek Diversion for Dedicated Side Channels

- Route a controlled portion of Bear Creek's flow (via gravity intake, pipe, or restored historic distributary) into engineered or reconnected side channels on the Dungeness floodplain.
- These side channels would be designed as deep, slow, vegetated backwaters and ponds—ideal overwintering and rearing habitat for juvenile coho (silvers) and Chinook.
- Because Bear Creek is a cooler, groundwater-influenced tributary, it would supply reliable baseflow even in late summer/low-flow years, keeping side channels wetted and productive when mainstem leakage alone might not suffice.

Why This Hybrid Wins for the Dungeness

- **Addresses summer chum needs** via the Jimmycomelately main-channel and floodplain reconnection (like the estuarine success at Sequim Bay).
- **Addresses coho and Chinook needs** via dedicated, flow-augmented side channels (which Jimmycomelately didn't require because its target species migrates quickly to the estuary).
- **Stays within the watershed** — no interbasin transfer controversies.
- **Multi-benefit** — Improves juvenile survival, flood storage, groundwater recharge, and water quality while creating exceptional interpretive/recreational opportunities (e.g., boardwalks overlooking salmon-filled side channels).

Park Compatibility

This hybrid vision allows the County to relocate conflicting trail segments (Perimeter/Northern Trace) outside the active floodplain and side-channel zones, while enhancing the park with:

- Elevated viewing platforms over restored meanders and side channels.
- Expanded powerline corridor trails and a potential pedestrian bridge westward.
- Interpretive signage explaining the innovative hybrid restoration.

In short: You've designed a **best-of-both-worlds** strategy—Jimmycomelately's elegant main-channel meander for flow and shade, plus proactive side-channel creation fed by Bear Creek diversion for the extended freshwater rearing that Dungeness salmon demand. This is exactly the kind of creative, science-based thinking that could deliver thriving salmon numbers while giving the community an even better park.



Public Comment Opposing the Dungeness Trails County Park Plan as Drafted, While Supporting Modifications Consistent with Best Available Science

Hello Commissioners and staff,

My name is John Worthington I live in/near the Dungeness area and care deeply about both public recreation and the health of the Dungeness River ecosystem.

I oppose the Dungeness Trails County Park master plan as **currently drafted**.

The plan places permanent trails and associated infrastructure directly through a high-priority floodplain reconnection corridor that has been identified by best available science as essential for salmon recovery. This corridor—highlighted in red on the park planning map—is precisely where the next phase of Jimmycomelately-style restoration must occur to restore natural meandering, side-channel habitat, and floodplain function for threatened Chinook, summer chum, steelhead, and bull trout.

The highly successful Jimmycomelately Creek restoration project nearby demonstrated that realigning flows and reconnecting floodplains to historic patterns can bring salmon populations back from the brink while also improving water quality, flood resilience, and public enjoyment. The same science-based approach is needed here on the Dungeness, as confirmed by the Puget Sound Salmon Recovery Plan, Jamestown S’Klallam Tribe co-management studies, and Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife guidance.

Under Washington’s Growth Management Act (RCW 36.70A.172), Clallam County is required to include the best available science when designating and protecting critical areas, including fish and wildlife habitat conservation areas. Development that causes a net loss of ecological functions in salmon-bearing floodplains violates the “no net loss” standard. Courts have repeatedly upheld this requirement, most notably in *Swinomish Indian Tribal Community v. Western Washington Growth Management Hearings Board* (2012), which mandates that scientific evidence be given substantial weight.

Placing trails through this restoration corridor would fragment habitat, increase human disturbance, and permanently prevent the natural river processes that salmon depend on. That outcome is neither legally defensible nor necessary.

However, I strongly support the park concept itself and believe it can—and should—move forward with relatively minor alterations. I just think it is a little short sighted.

The existing BPA powerline corridor through the park property offers an ideal, low-impact alignment for trail expansion. This cleared utility right-of-way already accommodates maintained access routes with minimal vegetation and no need for new clearing in forested or riparian zones. Extending and improving a multi-use trail along this corridor would:

- Provide a safe, scenic east west backbone trail suitable for hiking, biking, and equestrian use,
- Avoid entirely the red-lined floodplain reconnection area critical for Jimmycomelately-style restoration,
- Connect existing trail segments (such as the Power Line trail already shown on the map) into a more cohesive east-west park experience.

Furthermore, to maximize connectivity and recreational value, the County should seriously consider constructing a pedestrian/equestrian bridge across the Dungeness River to continue the trail system westward. Such a bridge would:

- Link the park to existing and future trails on the west side of the river, creating a much larger regional trail network,
- Provide safe river crossing for users without relying on road shoulders along busy corridors like River Road or Happy Valley Road,

- Enhance access to additional public lands and viewpoints while keeping all new infrastructure elevated above the floodplain and outside restoration zones.

This powerline trail expansion combined with a thoughtfully sited bridge would deliver substantial recreational benefits at lower environmental cost than the current plan's proposed loops through the restoration corridor. It represents a true win-win: expanded public access and connectivity without compromising the science-based salmon recovery efforts that state law requires us to protect.

I urge the County to incorporate powerline corridor trail enhancements and a westward bridge feasibility study into any revised park plan, ensuring that recreation grows in harmony with—rather than in conflict with—the Dungeness River's ecological needs.

There is ample room within the park property to reroute the conflicting trail segments (primarily portions of the Perimeter and Northern Trace loops) outside the priority restoration corridor. Such adjustments would:

- Allow the full park vision to be realized with little additional cost or delay,
- Preserve the integrity of the restoration corridor so that floodplain reconnection can proceed,
- Ultimately enhance the park by incorporating opportunities for salmon viewing, interpretive signage, and passive recreation within a healthier, more dynamic river landscape.

I would save the north south access to the beach areas and keep the foothill sectors east west. I would also limit north south to the Discovery trail.

A park built in harmony with best available science will provide superior long-term recreational value and serve as a model of responsible land stewardship.


Therefore, I respectfully urge the County to:

1. Reject the park master plan as currently drafted, and
2. Direct staff to revise the plan by relocating trail elements to avoid conflict with the Jimmycomelately-style restoration corridor identified by best available science.

This balanced approach honors both the public's desire for new recreational opportunities and our legal and ethical obligation to recover the Dungeness River's iconic salmon runs.

Thank you for your consideration. I am available for questions and would welcome the opportunity to work collaboratively toward a solution that benefits both people and salmon.

Good morning, Anne.

Thank you for taking the time to share your comments and concerns. I genuinely appreciate your insights. Many of the concepts we've discussed are still in the aspirational phase and have not yet undergone thorough vetting or public engagement. They also await review by our county leadership, which includes the volunteer advisory board, planning, finance, permitting, and the Board of County Commissioners. Consequently, the documentation may not yet reflect the level of detail you are seeking. Please be assured that there is no intention to bypass the necessary processes. I encourage you to connect with the Parks Advisory Board by writing to them or by attending their monthly meeting, which occurs on the first Tuesday of each month at 5:30 PM in the BOCC Board Room.

Moreover, recent community surveys and outreach have highlighted significant interest from several thousand county residents regarding the elements we've outlined. These ideas have emerged from broader community discussions.

Regarding the "kayak" project, it is a collaboration with a well-respected non-profit organization with a successful track record in planning, development, and operations. There are approximately 120 designated sites across Puget Sound and Vancouver Island, which serve both remote and densely populated areas. The expected impact of this proposed amenity is minimal, as its use will be restricted to kayakers on the marine trail, with no additional camping allowed. Furthermore, all current environmental permitting and review procedures will be strictly followed.

Thank you once again for your engagement. I look forward to further discussions.

Hi Don and Mike and Brian,

Dave forwarded these additional maps of proposed revisions to Salt Creek County Campground. I commented on the CC Parks Department Master Plan update a few weeks ago-but these map revisions weren't included in the draft plan that was offered for public review. Neither were the revisions provided in documents shared recently with the county commissioners, including the kayak group camp site proposed for the south side of the park, a commercial kayak concession at the day use area along lower Salt Creek, proposed pickleball courts (??) and other large park mission-shitting revisions.

I can't comment on what I don't have and dont appreciate the run around with this.

To the information now provided. Again, the proposed 'kayak' camp site along the south side of the park should absolutely not be implemented. The area is immediately adjacent to Camp Hayden Road and a large parking lot. It is a proposed group camp site which will immediately become a nuisance party site. As you all know we've had a significant and increasing problem with vagrants, crime, and wildfires in the area. The only LE control mechanism available is to keep the entire south side of the park as day use only, and camping within the formal gated area of the park. The proposed camp site *won't* be limited to kayakers-it will be come a party -and vagrant vehicle-destination. It will increase nuisance and criminal activity to the area. If kayakers want group camp sites there are a number at the Port Crescent RV park a quarter mile away. These privately run facilities have adequate staff and regulations to properly manage the use. Clallam County doesn't.

Similarly, the idea to set up a commercial gear concession stand anywhere in the county park should also not be implemented, much less at the small day use access area of lower Salt Creek. This is a county (public) park-not a commercial site. Such commercial venues will crowd limited parking, introduce another avenue of crime, garbage, and degrade the wild and remote nature experience of this park. It's unnecessary and inappropriate for a county park- most of all this park. If folks *have to have* a commercial concession at a county park we recommend the Freshwater Bay Boat Ramp, which is already developed for high volume boat/kayak access.

And finally, pickleball courts are similarly out of context for the recreational experience of Salt Creek County park. Such developed recreational facilities are more appropriate for an urban setting- for example, the city of Port Angeles-not a remote park next to high ecosystem value coastal old growth forest and bird and whale migration corridors. Keep this park to it's high value coastal wilderness experience that makes this park a top recreation destination- and avoid poorly visioned mission drift.

As a landowner and tax payer that has lived for over 30 years in Clallam County and supported so many elements of the county, please do let me know what else I can provide to ensure these comments are implemented.jas








SALT CREEK
