## **2020 Clallam County Commissioner Boundary Alternatives Discussion and Considerations**

The Clallam County Charter in Section 7.40 is very clear on the criteria to be used to define County Commissioner boundaries. These are:

1. Approximately equal population (within 5%)
2. Generally north-south boundaries
3. Geographically compact and contiguous
4. Whole voting precincts

Three Commissioner District alternatives have been identified that meet the above criteria.

Commissioner District boundaries adopted now will be in effect for the next ten years until the 2030 Census is taken. For this reason, working to keep District populations numerically close at this time is important.

Please refer to accompanying maps and tables.

### **Baseline (2020 Commissioner District Populations)**

As shown in the accompanying table, population growth in the county has remained somewhat proportional. All Commissioner Districts are within 5% of each other. However, the population difference between Districts 1 and 2 is now 4.9%.

### **Alternative 1**

Both Lost Mountain and Riverside Precincts south of Carlsborg would be moved from District 1 to District 2. In addition, Port Angeles Precinct 106 would be moved from District 2 to District 3. Population differences between Districts would be 0.62% between Districts 3 and 1, 1.23% between Districts 2 and 3 and 1.84% between Districts 1 and 2.

### **Alternative 2**

This alternative would move only the Lost Mountain Precinct from District 1 to District 2 keeping the Riverside Precinct adjacent to the east in District 1. All other precincts would remain in their current Commissioner District. Population differences between districts county-wide would range from 0.56% between Districts 2 and 3 to 3.51 between District 3 and 1.

### **Alternative 3**

In this alternative both Lost Mountain and Riverside Precincts would be moved from District 1 to District 2. The population differences between Districts 1 and 2 would be 0.28% and 2.18% between Districts 3 and 1.





#### Summary

Work to date to assure each County Commissioner District represents a population size that is within five percent of each other has followed an understanding that each district was to be within five percentage points of the entire population of the county. Multiple scenarios were presented in several public meetings to show voting precincts by census population numbers.

After a careful re-reading of the Clallam County Charter Section 7.40 it is clear that each Commissioner District is to be within five percent of each other in population without consideration of the population of the county as a whole. Functionally, this is a minor point but given the small size of the county population (77,155) and 67 individual precincts, comparatively small population changes make complying with the five percent population difference between districts challenging.

This being the context, the following Alternatives A, B, C and D have been calculated given strict interpretation of Clallam County Charter Section 7.40, public meeting input and responses by the public and Redistricting Commissioners to previously developed alternatives. Alternatives below all meet charter directives of north-south boundary lines, continuity and whole precincts. They vary for population compliance for reasons noted. Please refer to previously developed maps for precinct location.

Alternate A would move Carlsborg and Lost Mountain precincts from District 1 to District 2 and Port Angeles precinct 106 from District 2 to 3. This alternative DOES MEET the 5% charter requirement (4.56% maximum, 3.02% average) and incorporates the suggestions from the public hearing.

Alternative B would move Carlsborg, Lost Mountain and Riverside precincts from District 1 to 2 and Port Angeles 107 from District 2 to 3. This alternative does NOT MEET the population requirement (5.52% maximum, 3.66%

average) but was evaluated since the possibility of Port Angeles 107 was raised.

Alternative C would move Carlsborg, Lost Mountain and Riverside from District 1 to 2 and Port Angeles 106 from District 2 to 3. Of all the alternatives developed to date, this DOES MEET the 5% population (3.65% maximum, 2.42% average) requirement best.

Alternative D would move Lost Mountain and Riverside from District 1 to 2 and Port Angeles 106 from District 2 to 3. This alternative was strongly considered earlier but it DOES NOT meet population percentage (5.71% maximum, 3.78% average) requirements.

Conclusion: Alternatives A and C meet all criteria of Clallam County Charter Section 7.40.
