



WORDS FROM THE SHERIFF




ON BEHALF OF THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE I AM PROUD TO PRESENT OUR 2012 ANNUAL REPORT. IT IS A STRICTLY IN-HOUSE PRODUCTION RUN ON A MINIMAL BUDGET, BUT IT IS A SINCERE AND ACCURATE REFLECTION OF THE YEAR'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE HARD WORKING AND DEDICATED SHERIFF'S OFFICE EMPLOYEES.

THIS YEAR, OUR REPORT IS DEDICATED TO SHERIFF W. J. "JOE" HAWK, CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF FROM 1990 TO 2003. JOE WAS ELECTED TO FOUR TERMS AS SHERIFF. PRIOR TO THAT HE WAS THE CHIEF OF POLICE FOR SEQUIM FOR SEVERAL YEARS. FOLLOWING HIS EXECUTIVE LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE ON THE OLYMPIC PENINSULA, HE WORKED FOR THE WASHINGTON ASSOCIATION OF SHERIFFS AND POLICE CHIEFS AND WAS APPOINTED BY PRESIDENT BUSH TO BE THE U.S. MARSHALL FOR WESTERN WASHINGTON. FOLLOWING THIS HE WORKED AS THE DIRECTOR OF THE WASHINGTON STATE CRIMINAL JUSTICE TRAINING CENTER UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT. NEW HIRES:

DEPUTY LATICIA WELLS:



LATICIA WELLS WAS HIRED IN JANUARY 2012 AS A DEPUTY SHERIFF TO FILL A NEWLY ACQUIRED POSITION FUNDED BY THE JAMESTOWN S'KLALLAM TRIBE. THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROVIDES CONTRACTUAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES FOR THE JAMESTOWN S'KLALLAM TRIBE AND THIS NEW POSITION IS IN ADDITION TO ONE DEPUTY ALREADY FUNDED BY THE TRIBE.

DEPUTY JOSEPH PURSLEY:

JOE PURSLEY WAS HIRED IN APRIL 2012 AS A DEPUTY SHERIFF AFTER HAVING SERVED AS THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR AT THE FORKS ASSEMBLY OF GOD CHURCH AND AS A CCSO VOLUNTEER CHAPLAIN. DEPUTY PURSLEY IS ASSIGNED TO THE SHERIFF'S WEST END DETACHMENT.



DEPUTY GENE HOAGLAND:

GENE HOAGLAND WAS HIRED AS A SHERIFF'S DEPUTY AFTER HAVING WORKED AS A CITY OF FORKS POLICE OFFICER. DEPUTY HOAGLAND IS ASSIGNED TO THE SHERIFF'S WEST END DETACHMENT.

OPERATIONS SECTION



THE OPERATIONS SECTION OF THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE INCLUDES PATROL, DETECTIVES, TRAFFIC, AND MARINE UNITS. STAFFED BY HIGHLY TRAINED LAW ENFORCEMENT PROFESSIONALS, THESE INDIVIDUALS ARE AVAILABLE 24 HOURS A DAY TO RESPOND TO THE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY.



DEPUTIES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR INVESTIGATING AND HANDLING ALL CRIMES OCCURRING IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF CLALLAM COUNTY. A DEPUTY MAY RESPOND TO ANYTHING FROM A BARKING DOG TO A BURGLARY IN PROGRESS OR A HOMICIDE. IT IS THE DEPUTY'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE THE FIRST RESPONDER NO MATTER THE NATURE OF THE CALL, AND DEAL WITH THE SITUATION UNTIL ASSISTANCE CAN ARRIVE.

THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE HAS FOUR DETACHMENTS. THE DETACHMENTS ARE LOCATED IN SEQUIM, PORT ANGELES, FORKS, AND CLALLAM BAY. THE ONE-MAN PATROL CONCEPT IS USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING. THE DEPUTIES ARE ASSIGNED TO AN INDIVIDUAL CAR

FOR CALL OUT AVAILABILITY. THE DEPUTIES ASSIST OTHER AGENCIES AS WELL RECEIVING ASSISTANCE FROM THOSE AGENCIES AND HAVE FORMED A MUTUAL RELIANCE.



THE PATROL TEAM IS PART OF THE OPERATIONS DIVISION AND IS MADE UP OF FIVE SQUADS WITH EACH LED BY A PATROL SERGEANT. FOUR OF THE SQUADS ARE IN THE PORT ANGELES-SEQUIM AREA AND THE FIFTH SQUAD COMPRISES THE

WEST END AREA. THERE ARE A TOTAL OF 26 DEPUTIES IN PATROL WHICH INCLUDES ONE SERGEANT AND FOUR TO FIVE DEPUTIES PER SQUAD.

THE DEPUTIES PATROL ABOUT 1,754 MILES IN CLALLAM COUNTY. DEPUTIES HANDLED ABOUT 15,072 CALLS FOR SERVICE IN 2012. IN A LOT OF WAYS, THE DEPUTIES WORKED WITH COMMUNITY MEMBERS TO RESOLVE AND MINIMIZE PROBLEMS IN WELL REGARDED WORKING RELATIONSHIPS.



DETACHMENT I - SEQUIM



THE SEQUIM DETACHMENT IS CO-LOCATED WITHIN THE SEQUIM POLICE DEPARTMENT AND IS KNOWN AS THE EAST END DETACHMENT. THE AREA HAS THE LARGEST POPULATION AND IS THE FASTEST GROWING OF ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTY.



DEPUTIES RESPOND TO NUMEROUS CALLS FOR SERVICE FROM THE NUMEROUS RESIDENTIAL AND SUBURBAN AREAS OF THIS PART OF THE COUNTY. DEPUTIES ASSIGNED TO THIS AREA PROVIDE JAMESTOWN S'KALLAM TRIBE WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES AND ASSIST THE SEQUIM POLICE DEPARTMENT.



DETACHMENT II - PORT ANGELES DETACHMENT

DETACHMENT II IS LOCATED AT THE COUNTY SEAT IN PORT ANGELES AND IS THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE HEADQUARTERS

LOCATED IN THE CLALLAM COUNTY COURTHOUSE.

THE DETACHMENT EXTENDS TO ABOUT THE MIDWAY POINT BETWEEN PORT ANGELES AND SEQUIM TO THE EAST, AND EXTENDS TO THE TWIN RIVERS AREA ALONG THE COAST AND LAKE CRESCENT. TO THE SOUTH, THE DETACHMENT IS

BORDERED BY THE OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK AND TO THE NORTH, THE STRAITS OF JUAN DE FUCA.



DEPUTIES ASSIGNED TO THE AREA ASSIST POLICE OFFICERS FROM THE LOWER ELWHA KLALLAM TRIBE, PORT ANGELES POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE. WE ENTERED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE JAMESTOWN S'KLALLAM TRIBE TO HANDLE ALL THEIR TRIBAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES AND FUNDING FOR TWO DEPUTY POSITIONS .




DETACHMENT III & IV WEST END DETACHMENT

DETACHMENTS III AND IV ARE SITUATED IN THE MOST NORTHWESTERN CORNER OF THE COUNTY AND, FOR THAT MATTER, THE MOST NORTHWESTERN PART OF THE CONTIGUOUS UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. TOGETHER, THE TWO DETACHMENTS COVER OVER 1/2 OF CLALLAM COUNTY AND PROVIDE SERVICES TO SIX COMMUNITIES AND OVER 10,000 RESIDENTS. LARGELY FORESTED AND UNPOPULATED, THE WEST END DEPUTIES ARE GIVEN RESIDENT STATUS AND RESPOND TO CALLS IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNITIES. IT IS THE LARGEST AREA TO PATROL GEOGRAPHICALLY.



THE FORKS DETACHMENT OFFICE IS CURRENTLY LOCATED OUTSIDE OF FORKS.


DEPUTIES ASSIST THE FORKS POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE QUILEUTE TRIBAL POLICE IN LAPUSH, MAKAH TRIBAL POLICE IN NEAH BAY, DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, OLYMPIC NATIONAL PARK, U.S. COAST GUARD, AND JEFFERSON COUNTY IN A WIDE RANGE OF TASKS. THE FORKS AREA COMPRISES THE LARGER POPULATION OF THE WEST END AND DEPUTIES RESIDE THERE. THE WEST END DEPUTIES INVESTIGATE AND RESPOND TO CALLS IN BOTH DETACHMENTS.

MARINE PATROL UNIT

THE MARINE PATROL UNIT IS STAFFED BY SPECIALLY TRAINED DEPUTIES WHO PATROL THE LAKES, STRAITS OF JUAN DE FUCA, AND THE PACIFIC OCEAN. THE DEPUTIES CONDUCT JOINT PATROLS AND WORK WITH VARIOUS STATE AND FEDERAL AGENCIES SUCH AS THE WASHINGTON STATE FISH AND WILDLIFE, U. S. BORDER PATROL, AND U. S. COAST GUARD.



JOINT INTERAGENCY MARINE UNITS PARTICIPATE IN MOCK SMUGGLER INTERCEPT (BELOW).



THIS YEAR A NEW MARINE UNIT TRUCK PROVIDED BY A HOMELAND PORT SECURITY GRANT WAS A WELCOME ADDITION FOR "PROTECTOR" BOAT TOWING/TRANSPORTATION PURPOSES. UNIT MEMBERS PARTICIPATED IN ON-THE-WATER FIREARMS TRAINING EXERCISES. THE MARINE UNIT PATROLLED 405 HOURS, COMPLETED 1073 SPOT INSPECTIONS, AND 741 WRITTEN INSPECTIONS, AND PUBLIC SAFETY PRESENTATIONS FOR 2012.



FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT

THE FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT COMPRISES SIX FIREARMS INSTRUCTORS FROM OPERATIONS AND CORRECTIONS AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE OVERALL FIREARMS TRAINING, FIREARMS ACQUISITION, TESTING, AND EQUIPMENT DEVELOPMENT. THE UNIT IS STAFFED BY SUPERVISORS AND DEPUTIES UNDER A RANGE MASTER.



THE UNIT CONDUCTS BASIC/ ADVANCED PISTOL TRAINING, PATROL RIFLE TRAINING, FIREARM QUALIFICATIONS, AND REALISTIC BASED FIREARMS TRAINING AND EXERCISES MEETING THE DEPARTMENT'S NEEDS FOR OPERATIONS AND CORRECTIONS PERSONNEL AND PROVIDES TRAINING FOR AREA LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.



THE FIREARMS TRAINING UNIT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEFENSIVE TACTICS UNIT PROVIDES SCENARIO BASED REALISTIC TRAINING WITH ROLE PLAYERS IN VARIOUS SITUATIONS THAT MIGHT BE ENCOUNTERED ON DUTY. ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING HAS BEEN ADDED. NEW FOR 2012 IS A USE OF FORCE SIMULATOR TO COMPLIMENT THE CRITICAL ON GOING FIREARMS TRAINING.



SEX/KIDNAP OFFENDER REGISTRATION PROGRAM 2012 ACHIEVEMENTS

CLALLAM COUNTY HAS APPROXIMATELY 200 REGISTERED SEXUAL/KIDNAP OFFENDERS.

WE USE OFFENDER WATCH (OW) AS THE REGISTRATION TOOL TO TRACK SEXUAL AND KIDNAP OFFENDERS IN OUR COUNTY. IT IS A NATIONAL DATABASE AND EVERY SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN WASHINGTON STATE USES THIS PROGRAM TO TRACK ADDRESS CHANGES, MONITOR PROBATION REQUIREMENTS, CONVICTION INFORMATION AND SHARE INFORMATION WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AS THE OFFENDER MOVES FROM COUNTY TO COUNTY AND STATE TO STATE. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS NOW USES OW TO NOTIFY A SPECIFIC AGENCY WHEN AN OFFENDER WILL BE RELEASED TO THEIR JURISDICTION. OW HAS ENABLED AGENCIES TO HAVE BETTER COMMUNICATION AND BE ABLE TO NOTIFY AN AGENCY WHEN AN OFFENDER SHOULD BE REGISTERING IN THEIR JURISDICTION THEREFORE RESULTING IN QUICK ACTIONS BY THE OFFICE IF AN OFFENDER DOES NOT SHOW UP TO REGISTER.

OUR SEXUAL/KIDNAP OFFENDER REGISTRATION PROGRAM IS HELD IN HIGH REGARD WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE COUNTY RESULTING IN OUR OFFICE BEING A CORE PART OF OUR LOCAL TRIBAL AGENCIES BECOMING FEDERALLY COMPLIANT WITH THEIR INDIVIDUAL OFFENDER REGISTRATION PROGRAMS AND THE ADAM WALSH ACT.

OUR CIVIL DEPUTY IS A MEMBER OF THE SEXUAL OFFENDER REGISTRATION NOTIFICATION ACT (SORNA) POLICY BOARD GOVERNED AND ORGANIZED BY THE LOWER ELWHA KLALLAM TRIBE. THIS BOARD MEETS QUARTERLY AND HAS BECOME AN EFFECTIVE PART OF DEVELOPING A WORKING RELATIONSHIP IN REGARDS TO THE TRIBAL AGENCIES IMPLEMENTING SORNA POLICIES AND PROCEDURES UNDER THE ADAM WALSH ACT. THE GOAL IS TO DEVELOP A PROCESS AND UNDERSTANDING IN WHICH OUR AGENCIES WILL BE ABLE TO SHARE RESPONSIBILITIES OF REGISTRATION, TRACKING AND VERIFICATION OF SEXUAL AND KIDNAP OFFENDERS IN CLALLAM COUNTY WHO RESIDE, WORK OR ATTEND SCHOOL WITHIN THE TRIBAL JURISDICTION.

OUR OFFICE WILL CONTINUE TO SUPPORT AND MAINTAIN A WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE LOCAL TRIBAL AGENCIES TO ENSURE BEST PRACTICES AND STATUTE COMPLIANCES ARE MET FOR BOTH THE STATE OF WASHINGTON AND ADAM WALSH ACT. IT IS CERTAIN THAT COLLABORATION IS VITAL TO THE SUCCESS OF EACH AGENCIES COMMUNITY AWARENESS PROGRAM AND TO THE MONITORING AND TRACKING OF SEXUAL AND KIDNAP OFFENDERS IN CLALLAM COUNTY.

THE CIVIL SECTION WORKS VERY CLOSELY WITH CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE CORRECTIONS, OPERATIONS STAFF AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO ENSURE SEXUAL AND KIDNAP OFFENDER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS ARE PROCESSED CORRECTLY AND WORK VERY SWIFTLY AND EFFECTIVELY TOGETHER WHEN EXECUTING ON A SEXUAL OR KIDNAP FAILURE TO REGISTER. WITH THE CLOSE INTERACTION AND WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITHIN OUR OWN DEPARTMENT AND WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES THE CIVIL SECTION IS ABLE TO EFFECTIVELY KEEP TRACK OF REGISTERED OFFENDERS IN CLALLAM COUNTY.

Support Services Section



AEGIS MSP

STAFF CONTINUE TO WORK WITH NEW WORLD SYSTEMS TO TACKLE WARRANTY ITEMS, SOFTWARE SUGGESTIONS, PUSH OUT SERVICE PACK UPGRADES, AND TEST THE FULL VERSION 10 UPGRADE TO THE MSP SUITE OF APPLICATIONS THAT IS SOON TO BE RELEASED. SYSTEM MATTER EXPERT SYLVIA ORTH ATTENDS MONTHLY TECHNICAL MEETINGS AND THE ANNUAL REGIONAL USER GROUP MEETING TO NETWORK, BRAINSTORM, AND PARTNER WITH OTHER AGENCY USERS AND THE VENDOR SUPPORT STAFF IN SUPPORT OF THE SYSTEM. SYLVIA USES SOME FEATURES OF THE SYSTEM TO PROVIDE STATISTICAL AND ANALYTICAL SUPPORT TO DETECTIVES AND DEPUTIES WHICH INCLUDES PLOTTING MAPS, COMPILING CASE REPORTS IDENTIFIED BY DATA ANALYSIS AND MAPPING, AND PROVIDING CRIME STATISTICS FROM ANY OF THE INITIAL DATA COLLECTED BY THE INVESTIGATORS.

SECTOR REPORTING

AS MORE ELECTRONIC TICKETS ARE BEING ISSUED VIA SECTOR THROUGH CONTINUED DEPLOYMENT OF THE HARDWARE IN DEPUTIES VEHICLES, STAFF AND THE DISTRICT COURT ARE ENJOYING THE EASE OF THIS NEW PAPERLESS PROCESS. DEVELOPMENT AND DEPLOYMENT OF THE INTERFACE BETWEEN SECTOR AND OUR CRIMINAL RECORDS DATABASE WILL COMPLETE THE PROJECT.

ACCESS AUDIT

IN APRIL 2012 THE DEPARTMENT SUCCESSFULLY PASSED OUR TRIENNIAL AUDIT OF OUR USE OF THE WACIC/NCIC SYSTEMS. THIS ONSITE PHYSICAL SECURITY AUDIT WAS COORDINATED BY TERMINAL AGENCY COORDINATOR IDONA BAUMANN AND ALL EMPLOYEE USAGE WAS REVIEWED BY THE ACCESS AUDITOR. WITH A FEW MINOR UPDATES TO OUR WRITTEN PROCEDURE AND MORE STANDARDIZATION ON HOW WE RUN CRIMINAL HISTORY REQUESTS, WE ONCE AGAIN MET ALL REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTINUED USE OF THE SYSTEM.

COMMUNICATION IMPROVEMENTS

THE “LAW ENFORCEMENT DISPATCH RADIO NETWORK” (LEDRN, OR SECTOR DISPATCH) INSTALLATION WAS COMPLETED IN SECTOR PHASES BETWEEN JANUARY AND AUGUST, 2012. IMMEDIATE COVERAGE “HOLES” WERE DISCOVERED AS A RESULT OF THE “NARROWBANDING” WHICH WAS REQUIRED BY NEW FCC REGULATIONS. MUCH OF THE DEVELOPMENT WORK SINCE THEN HAS CONSISTED OF PLANNING FOR FILLING THOSE COVERAGE HOLES AS EFFICIENTLY AS POSSIBLE.

CONTINUED PROJECT DESIGN WORK TO FILL HOLES INCLUDES PUTTING SOME OF THE OPSCAN/LEDRN INFRASTRUCTURE ON THE 335-FT TOWER IN LOWER ELWHA, PUTTING IN-FILL RECEIVERS FOR THE CENTRAL AND EAST SECTORS ON A NEW KSQM TOWER ON BLUE MT. ROAD, INSTALLING A LOCAL RADIO AT LAPUSH, AND MAKING THE CENTRAL SECTOR SIMULCAST.


U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY OPERATION STONEGARDEN GRANT FUNDS WERE USED TO PURCHASE 103 DUAL-BAND (UHF AND VHF) PORTABLE RADIOS FOR ALL OF THE OFFICERS AND DEPUTIES IN FOUR AGENCIES THAT ARE DISPATCHED BY PENCOM. THE NEW RADIOS ARE ALL PROGRAMMED IDENTICALLY, AND INCLUDE RADIO FREQUENCIES FOR COOPERATING INTEROPERABLE AGENCIES, PLUS SOME FREQUENCIES THAT COULD BE USEFUL IN A LARGE GENERAL DISASTER. THE NEW RADIOS ALSO PERFORM MUCH BETTER IN THE LEDRN.

A DESIGN WAS DEVELOPED TO GIVE THE ANTENNAS ON THE COURTHOUSE ROOF BETTER PROTECTION AGAINST LIGHTNING OR DAMAGE TO ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT FROM NEARBY LIGHTNING STRIKES. THIS PROTECTION IS NECESSARY BEFORE A NEW SATELLITE SYSTEM OR CELLULAR BOOSTER FOR THE EOC CAN BE INSTALLED. THE SATELLITE SYSTEM WILL ALLOW CONNECTIONS BETWEEN THE COURTHOUSE, EOC, AND PENCOM, AND THE INCIDENT COMMAND VEHICLE (ICV) IN THE EVENT OF ANY OCCURRENCE THAT MIGHT DISRUPT NORMAL RADIO AND/OR TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS. A CELLULAR BOOSTER IS NEEDED TO SUPPORT PERSONNEL WHO MAY BE CALLED IN TO WORK IN THE EOC, SO THEIR AT&T AND VERIZON SMART PHONES WILL WORK THERE.





ONCE AGAIN ANOTHER YEAR HAS QUICKLY PASSED. DURING 2012 THE CORRECTIONS SECTION WAS CHALLENGED IN MANY WAYS AND I'M HAPPY AND PROUD TO SAY THAT EACH AND EVERY MEMBER OF OUR JAIL STAFF DUG IN AND MET THOSE CHALLENGES WITH PRIDE, PROFESSIONALISM AND DEDICATION TO OUR MISSION.

2012 BROUGHT WITH IT FOUR MAJOR CASES THAT INVOLVED JAIL PERSONNEL IN DIRECT SUPPORT OF FIELD OPERATIONS. THERE WAS THE LORING DOUBLE HOMICIDE AND SUBSEQUENT SUICIDE, FOLLOWED BY THE DRUM DOUBLE HOMICIDE AND RESULTING MANHUNT, THEN CAME THE HUMAN REMAINS DISCOVERED IN THE DRY LAKE BED OF FORMER LAKE ALDWELL AND FINALLY THE GIDDINGS ATTEMPTED HOMICIDE AND RESULTING MANHUNT. THEY ONLY NEED TO KNOW SOME BASIC INFORMATION ABOUT THE ARRESTED INDIVIDUAL AND BAIL AMOUNT WHICH CAN BE FOUND ON THE CLALLAM COUNTY CORRECTIONS FACILITY'S ONLINE JAIL ROSTER.

IN THE LAST YEAR, THERE HAVE BEEN BAIL POSTED ON 134 INDIVIDUALS TOTALING 106,217.00.

THEY DO MANY SERVICE PROJECTS AS WELL SUCH AS WORK WITH SEQUIM ORGANIC GARDNER'S AND LOCAL TRIBES. THE CHAIN GANG PROGRAM IS FUNDED IN PART BY THE COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, AS WELL AS THE WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY.

THE CHAIN GANG PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHES THE FOLLOWING: REDUCES THE COST OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT., DEVELOPS WORK HABITS AND ETHICS FOR INMATES., CLEANS UP ROADS AND DUMPSITES., PROVIDES SERVICES TO COMMUNITIES THAT MAY NOT, OTHERWISE BE FUNDED., CREATES POSITIVE ENVIRONMENTS FOR THE CITIZENS OF CLALLAM COUNTY TO ENJOY.

A NEW FEATURE TO THE CHAIN GANG PROGRAM IS ACTIVE DUMPSITE CAMERA'S. THESE CAMERA'S AID THE CHAIN GANG DEPUTIES IN PROSECUTING ILLEGAL DUMPING, ESPECIALLY IN KNOWN PROBLEM AREAS. SINCE IMPLEMENTATION, TOTAL ANNUAL TONNAGE OF DUMPSITE LITTER HAS BEEN SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED!

THE EVERBRIDGE SYSTEM WAS SELECTED AND IS NOW NAMED THE CLALLAM CO. ALERT SYSTEM. IT PROVIDES 'REVERSE 911' CAPABILITIES, MESSAGING BASED ON MAPS, GROUP LISTS, CITIZEN REQUESTS AND MANY OTHER OPTIONS AND IS BEING USED BY THE FIRE SERVICE AND LAW ENFORCEMENT ACROSS THE COUNTY.

THERE IS AN ANNUAL FEE BUT NO COST FOR MESSAGES SENT SO IT CAN BE USED FREELY AND OFTEN TO KEEP THE CITIZENS INFORMED OF UNFOLDING OR ANTICIPATED EVENTS. FEEDBACK FROM THE PUBLIC HAS BEEN OVERWHELMINGLY POSITIVE. DIRECTIONS TO SIGN UP ARE ON THE SHERIFF'S WEBPAGE:

NEW GENERAL, NEW DIRECTOR

OUR DEPARTMENT WAS ON HAND AT A RECEPTION IN TACOMA, WA INTRODUCING THE NEW DIRECTOR FOR WA STATE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, ROBERT EZELLE AND THE NEW ADJUTANT GENERAL FOR WA STATE, MAJ. GEN. BRET DAUGHERTY.

THE **OLYMPIC ISLANDS BRIDGE PROJECT (AKA OPERATION ARCHIPELAGO)** BEGAN UNDER THE DIRECTION OF UNDERSHERIFF PEREGRIN TO DEVELOP MAPS WITH MILE MARKERS. THE MAPS WILL BE USED AS PREPAREDNESS, EXERCISE AND REAL WORLD RESPONSE TOOLS FOR THE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM IN THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER. PHASE II OF THE PROJECT WAS TO LOCATE ALL BRIDGES IN CLALLAM COUNTY ON THE WORKING MAP AND DETERMINE THE "ISLAND GROUPS" OF WHICH RESPONDER GROUPS WILL NEED TO PREPARE FOR IN RESPONSE AND RECOVERY ACTIVITIES. DARCEY HODGES, STUDENT INTERN FROM THE AMERICAN MILITARY UNIVERSITY, WAS TASKED WITH LOCATING THE BRIDGES AND MARKING EACH ONE ON OUR WORKING MAP. SHE ALSO CREATED TWO OTHER MAP SOURCES TO BE CROSS-REFERENCED WITH THE INITIAL BRIDGE MAP. PHASE III HAS THE CCSO INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM TRANSFERRING THE BRIDGE LOCATION INFORMATION TO THE EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTER ROAD MAP BOOKS. THIS WORK HAS BEEN DONE COLLABORATIVELY WITH STARLA JODOIN OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

OPERATION ARCHIPELAGO IS A PLANNING & RESPONSE TOOL THAT ALLOWS OUR VOLUNTEER RESPONDERS TO WORK FROM A GRID AND SEARCH OUT PROBABLE LOCATIONS THAT WOULD BE USED BY EMU FOR SHELTERS – HUMAN & DOMESTIC ANIMALS, TSUNAMI QUICK RESPONSE ASSEMBLY AREAS, STAGING AREAS FOR LAW AND FIRE RESPONSE, AS WELL AS MESSAGE CENTERS FOR THE RESPONDERS, CITIZENS, AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS, THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS. ADDITIONAL STATE AND FEDERAL RESPONSE PARTNERS WERE IMPRESSED WITH THE RESULTS FROM OPERATION ARCHIPELAGO AND HAVE ASKED FOR COPIES TO USE AT THEIR AGENCY'S SITES.

THE **UNITED STATES COAST GUARD NATIONAL LEVEL TRAINING ON RISK COMMUNICATIONS AND JOINT INFORMATION CENTER** WAS BROUGHT TO THE CLALLAM COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TRAINING SCHEDULE BY DICK HALSAVER, INCIDENT MANAGEMENT VOLUNTEER TEAM COORDINATOR. THIRTY-TWO RESPONDERS FROM EIGHTEEN DIFFERENT AGENCIES ATTENDED.

USCG CAPTAIN SCOTT FERGUSSON, CAPTAIN OF THE PORT FOR SECTOR PUGET SOUND, PRESENTED ON RISK COMMUNICATIONS DURING OPERATION DEEP HORIZON. HE SHARED PRACTICES TO FOLLOW BASED ON EXPERIENCES FROM OPERATION DEEP HORIZON IN THE GULF OF MEXICO THAT WE SHOULD PRACTICE IN CLALLAM COUNTY.

IN JUNE 2012, EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AUTHORED AND ADMINISTERED THE FIRST **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS LAND TRANSPORT STUDY FOR CLALLAM COUNTY**. A RECORDING CHOKE POINT WAS ESTABLISHED AT THE SEVEN CEDARS CASINO/BLYN FIRE STATION USING THE INCIDENT COMMAND VEHICLE. THE SECOND RECORDING CHOKE POINT WAS ESTABLISHED ALONG HWY 101 AT THE FORKS TRANSIT CENTER. VOLUNTEERS FROM THE CLALLAM COUNTY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM, COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAMS, OLYMPIC PENINSULA CHAPTER OF THE RED CROSS, AND THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE SEARCH & RESCUE UNIT AND THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UNIT WORKED TWO SEPARATE 24 HOUR PERIODS AT THE RECORDING SITES. FINDINGS INDICATED THAT THE BLYN SITE CAPTURED DATA ON MORE TRANSPORTATION OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENTS THAN DID THE FORKS TRANSIT GATEWAY POINT OF THE OLYMPIC PENINSULA. FINDINGS FROM HAZARDOUS MATERIAL PLACARDS ON OVER 750 VEHICLES PROVIDED INFORMATION ON THE MOST TRANSPORTED MATERIAL AND THE MOST DANGEROUS MATERIAL ON OUR HIGHWAY 101 TRANSPORT CIRCUIT THROUGH CLALLAM COUNTY. THIS INFORMATION IS NOW BEING USED IN OUR EXERCISE DESIGN PROCESS AND OUR RESPONSE TRAINING. THIS INFORMATION IS HELPFUL IN IDENTIFYING THE HIGHEST FREQUENCY OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TRANSPORTED ACROSS CLALLAM COUNTY ROADWAYS. THE TWO MORE UNCOMMON FINDINGS WERE OF SULFURIC ACID AND BISULFATE'S. BOTH OF THESE HAVE A 150 FT DIAMETER HOT ZONE. GASOLINE WAS THE MOST COMMON RECORDED HAZARDOUS MATERIAL.

COMMUNITY POLICING

THE CLALLAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE IS COMMITTED TO COMMUNITY POLICING THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS WITH THE CITIZENS AND BUSINESSES IN THE COUNTY. THE BASIC CONCEPT OF COMMUNITY POLICING IS TO BRING TOGETHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE PUBLIC TO WORK AS A TEAM IN AN EFFORT TO IMPROVE THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH WE ALL LIVE. COMMUNITY POLICING IS AN EFFECTIVE AND PROACTIVE PROCESS WHICH HAS PROVEN TO REDUCE CRIME, IMPROVE COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE PUBLIC AND LAW ENFORCEMENT AS WELL AS REDUCE THE FEAR OF CRIME.

OUR COMMUNITY POLICING TEAM IS LED BY LORRAINE SHORE, COMMUNITY POLICING SERVICES COORDINATOR AND AN AMAZING CADRE OF VOLUNTEERS WHO DONATE THOUSANDS OF HOURS EACH YEAR TO THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE. WE HAVE AN ACTIVE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM IN CLALLAM COUNTY WHICH IS EXTREMELY SUCCESSFUL THANKS TO OUR VOLUNTEERS WHO DEDICATE THEIR TIME AND EFFORTS TO THE CITIZENS OF CLALLAM COUNTY. WORKING IN CLOSE PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CODE ENFORCEMENT TEAM, OUR COMMUNITY POLICING TEAM HAS MADE A SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR MANY OF CLALLAM COUNTY'S RESIDENTS.

EACH YEAR THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE PARTICIPATES IN EVENTS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY DESIGNED TO PROVIDE EDUCATION TO RESIDENTS ABOUT THE MANY SERVICES AND PROGRAMS THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE OFFERS. THE PROGRAMS INCLUDE, NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH, PROJECT LIFE-SAVER, RADAR TRAILER, MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD, VOLUNTEERS IN POLICE SERVICE, ANONYMOUS TIP REPORTING SERVICE, CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY SEAT TECHNICIANS AND THE NEW CLALLAM COUNTY ALERT SYSTEM WHICH REPLACED NIXLE.

THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE HOLDS AN ANNUAL BBQ ON LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL DAY WHICH BRINGS TOGETHER LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS FROM AROUND THE COUNTY TO REMEMBER THOSE WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES IN THE LINE OF DUTY. THIS BBQ IS MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH DONATIONS FROM COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND THE HARD WORK OF THE SHERIFF'S VOLUNTEERS WHO SERVE APPROXIMATELY 200 LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL AT THE EVENT.


