DDA Home & Community-Based Services Waivers

Nearly all services delivered through the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) are through a federal Home & Community Based Services (HCBS) waiver. They're called waivers because they waive the option to receive services in an institutional setting, choosing instead to receive the same or similar services in their own home and community. DDA has five different waivers, each with their own set of services and funding limits.

IFS
Individual & Family Services
ALL AGES

For children and adults living in the family home. Services include (but are not limited to): Assistive Technology, Respite, Skilled Nursing, Positive Behavior Support & Consultation, Environmental Adaptations, Vehicle Modifications, Specialized Medical Equipment/Supplies, OT/PT, Speech, Hearing & Language Services, Staff/Family Consultation & Training, Transportation, Peer Mentoring, Person-Centered Planning Facilitation, Supported Parenting, Community Engagement. Annual funding levels are based on assessed need: \$1,200, \$1,800, \$2,400, \$3,600.

BASIC PLUS
ALL AGES

For children and adults living in the family home or other community-based setting (such as Adult Family Homes) whose ability to continue being supported in that setting is at risk without additional services. Services include (but are not limited to): Respite, Skilled Nursing, Positive Behavior Support & Consultation, Environmental Adaptations, Specialized Medical Equipment/Supplies, OT/PT, Speech, Hearing & Language Services, Specialized Psychiatric Services, Staff/Family Consultation & Training, Transportation, Supported Employment, Community Guide/Inclusion.

CORE
ALL AGES

For children and adults at immediate risk of out-of-home placement who have a need that cannot be met by the Basic Plus waiver, and who may need up to 24-hour residential services that include training and education; or, who may require daily to weekly one-on-one support for physical or health needs. Services include most services under Basic Plus*, as well as supported living and community transition services. (*CORE waiver services provide more funding for services than Basic Plus, based on assessed need.)

CIIBS
Children's Intensive In-Home Behavioral Support
AGES 8-20

For children (ages 8-20) living in the family home who are at risk of out-of-home placement due to the intensity of their behavioral challenges. Services include: positive behavior support and team based planning that builds upon strengths and works toward outcomes driven by the family. Each child's team includes family, friends, providers, school staff, and others. The family partners with a behavior specialist to create and follow a positive behavior support plan that fits the whole family. Other services include (but are not limited to): Respite, Assistive Technology, Environmental Adaptations, Specialized Medical Equipment & Supplies.

COMMUNITY PROTECTION
ADULTS

For adults who need 24-hour on-site awake staff supervision and therapies to maintain their own and community safety. The goal of the Community Protection program is to provide a structured, therapeutic environment for persons with community protection issues in order for them to live safely and successfully in the community while minimizing the risk to public safety. Community Protection services include all services under the CORE waiver, except: Community Guide, Respite, Wellness Education, Community Inclusion.

There is a new process for completion of the Developmental Disabilities Specialty Training

- Developmental Disabilities Specialty Training is now a **four hour online course with only 2 days of in class training**, for a total of 16 training hours.
- To begin the online portion you must be registered for a DD class to get the site address, login and password.
- All four online modules must be completed **BEFORE** attending the in class portion of the training.
- You **must bring the printed and completed study guide** from the online portion to the in class training as proof of completing the 4 hours of online modules.
- Training is limited to 25 attendees, and registration will be closed once all openings have been filled.

DD Specialty Training is still a **FREE** introductory training intended for individuals who support people with developmental disabilities. Specialty Training hours can be used for a possible 16 approved hours see WAC 388-112-0225 and 388-829-0240. You must complete online portions and attend both days, then pass a written test to receive your specialty designation and certificate. Successful completion of this class fulfills the WAC requirement for AFH, Assisted Living homes and Alternative Living providers. This is **NOT** an approved CE class for Individual Care Providers.

The meeting site is handicapped accessible and additional assistance or accommodation is available upon request, please make this request at least 2 weeks prior to the training.
