


Remember to Sign Your Return Envelope

Your signature is needed to make sure your ballot gets counted.

- The signature on your return envelope is compared to the signature on your voter registration record. Trained election officials verify each and every signature.
- If your signature is missing or does not match your voter registration record, the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office will contact you by mail **before results are certified**. You may also be called or emailed if that information is available.
- If you registered to vote online or through Department of Licensing, the signature from your driver's license, permit, or state ID will be on your voter registration record.



To Register to Vote, You Must Be

- A citizen of the United States.
- A legal resident of Washington state for at least 30 days prior to Election Day.
- At least 18 years old.
If you are 16 or 17, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify.
- Not disqualified from voting due to court order.
- Not currently serving a sentence of total confinement in prison under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections for a Washington felony conviction.
- Not currently incarcerated for a federal or out-of-state felony conviction.

Complete and return a Washington State Voter Registration form. Forms must be received in the Elections and Voter Registration Office by February 5, 2024.

In Person

Come in to the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Registration Deadlines:

- Online (Washington I.D. required) and by mail through February 5, 2024.
- Elections and Voter Registration Office, in person through February 13, 2024 until 8:00 p.m.

Returning Your Ballot

By Official Ballot Drop Box

Drop Boxes are open 20 days before Election Day, 24 hours a day until 8:00 p.m. on Election Night.

Returning your ballot to a drop box reduces the cost of postage for the election.

Sequim – 651 W Washington St, in the parking lot

Clallam Bay – 16990 Hwy 112, in front of the Clallam Bay Branch Library

Forks – 500 E Division St, outside Forks City Hall

Neah Bay – 1450 Bayview Ave, in front of Washburn's General Store by the left Totem Pole

Seki – 15 Sekiu Airport Road, at the PUD in the drive-up lane

By Mail

No stamp is necessary if you use the return envelope that is provided with your ballot. Please make sure to have a postmark on or before February 13, 2024 when mailing your ballot. Check with your local Post Office for postmark cutoff times on Election Day.

Accessible Voting

Clallam County voters with disabilities have the option of voting independently and privately using an Accessible Voting Unit (AVU) at the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office. Available January 24 - February 13.

Educational Programs and Operations Levy

The Board of Directors of Cape Flattery School District No. 401 adopted Resolution No. 24-05, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operations expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's General Fund educational programs and operations expenses:

Explanatory Statement

Passage of Proposition No. 1 would allow Cape Flattery School District to replace an expiring educational programs and operation levy. Taxes collected by this replacement levy will be used to pay expenses of educational programs and operations not funded by the State, including but not limited to class size reduction, special education, health services staff, counselors, library resources, technology updates, classified staff, athletics and extracurricular activities, instructional materials and supplies, and facility maintenance and operations.

The proposed four-year replacement levy would authorize collection of up to \$439,860 in 2025, \$453,055 in 2026, \$466,647 in 2027, and \$480,646 in 2028. The exact tax levy rate and amount to be collected may be adjusted based upon the actual assessed value of the taxable property within the District and the limitations imposed by State law at the time of the levy. Exemptions from taxes may be available, call Clallam County Assessor, (360) 417-2400.
