INTRODUCTION TO THE 2000 PRIMARY VOTERS PAMPHLET



It is our pleasure to introduce you to the Washington State Voters Pamphlet for the September 19 primary. In several respects, this guide represents another milestone in Washington's 90-year tradition of promoting voter information and education.

This year, the Office of the Secretary of State and the Washington State Courts have teamed up to provide expanded information about judicial candidates in the Washington State Voters Pamphlet. For your convenience, this guide incorporates judicial candidate statements and biographies previously published in a separate Judicial Voters Pamphlet.

This is also the first-ever Washington State Voters Pamphlet published for a primary. As directed by the State Constitution, the Office of the Secretary of State has published a pamphlet about ballot measures since 1914 - a service which was expanded in 1966 to include information about candidates appearing on the general election ballot. Now, voters have a guide to candidates running in the primary.

The primary is a pivotal step in our elections process. Hundreds of candidates for federal, state, legislative and judicial offices appear on the primary ballot around our state. In the primary, voters narrow the choices and determine who will go on the general election ballot. In addition, candidates for some judicial offices are actually elected in the primary. Voters expect and deserve comprehensive, balanced information about these candidates.

This pamphlet is an example of the many special rights and privileges we enjoy as citizens of Washington state. We hope it will assist you in making informed decisions about this year's elections.

VOTING IN THE STATE OF WASHINGTON

Voter Qualifications

To register to vote you must be:

- A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident of Washington state
- At least 18 years old by election day.

In Washington, you do not have to declare political party membership when you register to vote.

Registration Deadlines

While you may register to vote at any time, keep in mind that there are registration deadlines prior to each election. You must be registered at least **30 days** before an election if you register by mail or through the Motor Voter program. You may register **in person**, at the office of your county auditor or election department, up to 15 days before an election. However, you must vote by absentee ballot for that particular election. The phone number and address of your county auditor or election department is located in this pamphlet.

How to Register

Complete a voter registration form and put it in the mail. Forms are available from your county auditor or election department, public libraries, schools, other government offices or the Internet. You may also request a form through the State Voter Hotline. (See *Services and Additional Assistance on this page.*)

Keep Your Voter Registration Up-to-date

If your voter registration record does not contain your *current* name or address, you may not be able to vote. You can use the mail-in voter registration form to let your county auditor or election department know when you move or change your name.

Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballot requests must be made to your county auditor or election department (not the Secretary of State). No absentee ballots are issued on election day except to

hospitalized voters. You may request a ballot by phone, fax or mail as early as 45 days before an election. You may also apply **in writing** to automatically receive an absentee ballot before each election. You can find an absentee ballot request form on the back page of this pamphlet. ***If you have already requested an absentee ballot or have a permanent request for a ballot on file, please do not submit another application.***

Once you receive your absentee or mail-in ballot, vote it. **Please do not** attempt to vote at the poll site. Absentee and mail-in ballots must be signed and postmarked or delivered to your county auditor or election department **on or before** election day.

Election Dates and Poll Hours

The primary is September 19th and the general election is November 7, 2000. Polling place hours for all primaries and elections are 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Contact your county auditor or election department for help with voting your ballot or finding your polling location. The phone number and address of your county auditor or election department is located in this pamphlet.

PUBLIC ACCESS TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING REPORTS

Contributions to Candidates and Political Committees: No person may make contributions to a State Legislative Candidate that exceeds \$600 per election in which the candidate's name is on the ballot. Contributions to State Executive Candidates may not exceed \$1,200 in the primary and \$1,200 in the general election. A person may give unlimited funds to the exempt activities account of a political party, to ballot issue committees or to other political committees. During the 21 days before the general election, however, a person may contribute no more than \$5,000 to a local or judicial office candidate, political party or other political committee. Contributions from corporations, unions, businesses, associations and similar organizations are permitted, subject to limits and other restrictions.

Registration and Reporting by Candidates and Political Committees: No later than two weeks after an individual becomes a candidate or a political committee is organized, a campaign finance registration statement must be filed with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) and the local county elections office. (Committees that form within three weeks of the election must register within three business days.) The candidate or committee treasurer is also required to report periodically the source and amount of campaign contributions over \$25 and to list campaign expenditures. The occupation and employer of individuals giving \$100 or more to a campaign must also be identified.

These reports may be inspected and copied at PDC's Olympia office, the county elections office in the county where the candidate lives, and on the Internet (<http://www.pdc.wa.gov>). Every candidate and political committee participating in the election also must make their actual records available for public review during the eight days before the election. Each campaign's registration form will show when and where these records will be located on the eighth day before the election. For access on one of the other days, except Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, contact the campaign for an appointment.

Independent Campaign Expenditures: Anyone making expenditures totaling \$100 or more in support of or opposition to a state or local candidate or ballot proposition (not including contributions made to a candidate or political committee) must file a report with PDC and their county elections office within five days. Forms are available from PDC, the county election office or can be downloaded from the PDC web site. Also, all political advertising must identify the person paying for the ad and may have to include other information.

Federal Campaigns: Contributions to U.S. Senate and House of Representative candidates are regulated by federal law. An individual may contribute a maximum of \$1,000 in the primary election and \$1,000 in the general election to each candidate for U.S. Senator and U.S. Representative. Corporations and unions are prohibited from contributing from their general treasury funds to federal campaigns. Contributions may be made from separate segregated funds (also called political action committees or PACs). Copies of the federal campaign finance reports are available from the Federal Election Commission (FEC).



The whole concept is really simple. What should we tax? We should tax land (but not buildings), natural resources (gifts of creation, common goods for everyone), and polluters. What Washington State taxes should we abolish? We should phase out the B&O Tax (Business and Occupation Tax), the sales tax, the L&I tax (state compensation for injured workers). We can keep the sin taxes on liquor and tobacco and perhaps add one on drugs if controlled substances are legalized. Alcohol, tobacco and drugs are forms of pollution to the human body.

Now, what can we do about taxing to pay for transportation needs – roads, bridges, HOV lanes, bicycle lanes, ferries, transit, light rail, etc? We rid ourselves of the gas tax (a 1913 relic) and instigate a tax on all vehicles based on miles-driven and their weight. This could be phased in with a global-positioning device installed in each car – a computerized, sophisticated odometer that is tamper-proof.

Contention is made that the Attorney General is compelled, under the constitution and statutes, to represent state officers, and that therefore she cannot begin an action wherein state officers are

defendants. Attention is called to where it is made the duty of the Attorney General to defend all actions against any state officer. The legitimate conclusion of such an argument is that the Attorney General must, if such a situation arise, sit supinely by and allow state officers to violate their duties and be recreant to their trusts, and that instead of preventing such actions it is her duty to defend the delinquents. The law can not be given any such construction. Her paramount duty is made the protection of the interest of the people of the state and, where she is cognizant of violations of the constitution or the statutes by a state officer, her duty is to obstruct and not to assist; and where the interests of the public are antagonistic to those of state officers, or where state officers may conflict among themselves, it is impossible and improper for the Attorney General to defend such state officers. JUDICIAL VOTER INFORMATION

Making Your Judicial Selections

There are four court levels in Washington's court system:

- **Supreme Court**
- **Court of Appeals**
- **Superior Court**
- **District and Municipal Courts.**

Two types of information are shown for each judicial candidate listed in this pamphlet: 1) A brief biography, supplied by the candidate, which includes the candidate's background and professional experience; and 2) A brief, unedited statement, written by the candidate, about why you should vote for that individual.

Candidates' statements are governed by Canon 7 of Washington's *Code of Judicial Conduct*. The code bars judicial candidates from making statements that appear to commit them on legal issues likely to come before them in court. It also says they may not make misleading or untruthful statements.

How We Select Judges in Washington State

Nonpartisan Election. The state's original 1889 constitution said any person who wanted to be a judge first had to be nominated by a political party. In 1912, Washington voters amended the constitution, adopting nonpartisan elections as the way to select judges.

Appointment. When a justice of the Washington Supreme Court, or a judge of the state Court of Appeals or a Superior Court resigns or dies during a term of office, the Governor appoints a new judge to fill that position. The appointed judge must run in the next election, which may be contested. When a judicial vacancy occurs mid-term in a district court, county commissioners appoint a replacement, and the new judge must run in the next election.

All judges who complete their terms and wish to serve another, must stand for a nonpartisan election.

The Importance of the Primary


In most instances, a judicial candidate who is unopposed or who receives more than half of the votes in a primary is thereby elected to the position—he or she does not have to run in the November general election. But if there are three or more candidates, and no one wins more than half the votes cast, the two with the most votes must face each other in the November general election. However, according to a state law (RCW 29.21.015), names of *district court candidates in two-candidate races* will **not** appear on September primary ballots. Instead, they will be listed on the November general election ballot. But, if *three or more candidates* file for the district court position, all will be listed on your primary ballot. If no one wins a majority of votes in the primary, the two with the most votes will advance to the general election.

Candidates in **all** contested *district court* races are listed in this pamphlet. Keep this pamphlet if you need to vote for candidates in the November general election.






"K-1 Rainbow"


