How to Vote




Use a dark colored pen to completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.

Vote for ONLY one in each contest.

If you vote for more than one choice, your vote will not count for that race or measure.

How to Correct a Vote



To make a correction, draw a line through the entire incorrect choice. You then have the option of making another choice.

Optional Write-in

To vote for a write-in candidate, fill in the oval next to the write-in line and print the name.

Advisory Votes

Advisory Vote No. 39
Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5974

The legislature increased, without a vote of the people, the tax on aircraft fuel from 11 cents to 18 cents per gallon, costing \$14 million in its first ten years, for government spending.

Engrossed Substitute House Bill 2076
