



Public Works - Bullman Beach Water System 43401.611

Mission Statement

The Bullman Beach Water System (BBWS) is a Group A Public Water System with 22 approved connections that is out of compliance with state health requirements. In 2020, Clallam County was appointed as the receiver for the BBWS by Superior Court and tasked with bringing the system into compliance with state requirements and standards.

Function

A key requirement for bringing the BBWS into compliance with health standards is the installation of a state-approved water treatment (i.e., filtration) plant. Filtration is required due to the shallow well that is the source of water being classified as under the direct influence of a surface water source. The Clallam County Public Works Department manages the BBWS and administers user utility billings.

Trends/Events

- Clallam County Public Works has retained services of a certified water treatment plant operator for the BBWS.
- A contract for design/engineering of filtration plant has been awarded to consultants
- The Board of County Commissioners approved awarding \$250,000 of the County's allocated share of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to support the final design and construction of the bag filtration water treatment plant.
- It is anticipated that final design, permitting, and award of contract of the filtration water treatment plant will be completed in 2024.
- Construction of treatment plant is expected to be in 2025.

Goals

- Complete final design and construction of a bag filtration water treatment plant for the BBWS that meets the approval of the Washington State Department of Health requirements and standards.
- Return water system management back to the Bullman Beach Water Association users.
