


Remember to Sign Your Return Envelope

Your signature is needed to make sure your ballot gets counted.

- The signature on your return envelope is compared to the signature on your voter registration record. Trained election officials verify each and every signature.
- If your signature is missing or does not match your voter registration record, the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office will contact you by mail **before results are certified**. You will also be called or emailed if that information is available.
- If you registered to vote online with your Washington driver's license, permit, or state ID number, or through Department of Licensing, the signature from your driver's license, permit, or state ID will be on your voter registration record.



To Register to Vote, You Must Be

- A citizen of the United States.
- A Washington State resident.
- At least 16 years old.
If you are 16 or 17, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify.
- Not disqualified from voting due to court order.
- Not currently serving a sentence of total confinement under the jurisdiction of the department of corrections for a Washington felony conviction.
- Not currently incarcerated for a federal or out-of-state felony conviction.

By Mail

Complete and return a Washington State Voter Registration form. Forms must be **received** in the Elections and Voter Registration Office by February 3, 2025.

In Person

Visit the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Registration Deadlines:

- Online and by mail through February 3, 2025.
- Elections and Voter Registration Office, in person through February 11, 2025 until 8:00 p.m.

Returning Your Ballot

By Official Ballot Drop Box

Drop Boxes are open 20 days before Election Day, 24 hours a day until 8:00 p.m. on Election Night.

Returning your ballot to a drop box reduces the cost of postage for the election.

Clallam Bay – 16990 Hwy 112, in front of the Clallam Bay Branch Library

Forks – 500 E Division St, outside Forks City Hall

Neah Bay – 1450 Bayview Ave, in front of Washburn's General Store by the left Totem Pole

Seki – 15 Sekiu Airport Road, at the PUD in the drive-up lane

By Mail

No stamp is necessary if you use the return envelope that is provided with your ballot. Please make sure to have a postmark on or before February 11, 2025 when mailing your ballot. Check with your local Post Office for postmark cutoff times on Election Day.

Accessible Voting

January 22 - February 11: Clallam County voters with disabilities have the option of voting independently and privately using an Accessible Voting Unit at the Clallam County Elections and Voter Registration Office (Room 042).

Proposition No. 1

REPLACEMENT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONS LEVY

The Board of Directors of Quillayute Valley School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 03-24/25, concerning a proposition for a replacement levy for education. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State:

Explanatory Statement

Passage of this proposition would help Quillayute Valley School District fund educational programs, maintenance and operations not funded by the State, including, but not limited to, non-basic education teachers, support staff, technology, curriculum, transportation, athletics and facility maintenance and operations, and other educational programs, maintenance and operations expenses. The proposed levy will replace the District's current levy approved by the voters in 2021 that expires at the end of calendar year 2025. Taxes collected by the proposed levy, together with state levy equalization money that is contingent upon levy passage, will provide approximately 10% of the District's General Fund budget.

Passage of this proposition would authorize the collection of taxes to provide \$1,510,000 each year from 2026 through and including 2029. The tax levy rate required to produce these levy amounts is estimated to be \$1.50 in 2026, \$1.40 in 2027, \$1.26 in 2028 and \$1.13 in 2029 (approximate levy rate per \$1,000 of assessed value).
