Armed Robber Sentenced to 15 Years Prison

Clallam County Superior Court Cause No. 25-1-00047-05

During closing hours of March 18, 2024, an armed person entered the *Dollar Tree* store, held two employees at gunpoint and demanded money. After receiving money from the employees, the robber fled the scene in a stolen vehicle.

The Clallam County Sheriff's Office's Criminal Investigation Bureau (CIB) subsequently identified the armed robber as Justin Radisich. The Clallam County Prosecuting Attorney's Office charged Radisich with two counts of robbery in the first degree with firearm enhancements, unlawful possession of a firearm in the second degree, and possession of a stolen vehicle.

On May 21, 2025, Radisich pleaded guilty to two counts of robbery in the first degree with firearm enhancements; class A felonies. Clallam County Superior Court Judge Simon Barnhart sentenced Justin J. Radisich to 180 months prison followed by 18 months of community custody. Radisich was ordered to register as a felony firearm offender upon his release and lifetime protection orders were issued protecting the employees from the *Dollar Tree* store.

"This was a very traumatic event for the employees, one which changed their lives forever," said Michele Devlin, Chief Criminal Deputy Prosecuting Attorney. The Clallam County Prosecuting Attorney's Office appreciates the diligent work by the CIB.

Office Info:

The Clallam County Prosecuting Attorney's Office employs over 25 people, including 13 attorneys. Clallam County, which includes Forks, Port Angeles and Sequim, has an approximate population of 78,000.

The Criminal Division represents the state and the county in criminal matters in the Clallam County District and Superior Courts. The Criminal Division is responsible for prosecuting all felonies in Clallam County and all misdemeanors in unincorporated areas of Clallam County as well as the Cities of Port Angeles and Sequim.

The Civil Division acts as the law firm representing the County and its agencies. The Civil Division advises and represents all the County's elected officials and departments on a myriad of complex legal matters. The range of legal representation provided by this unit is expansive and covers virtually every aspect of civil practice.

The Child Support Division is wholly funded by and represents the Division of Child Support of the State of Washington. The Support Division carries out judicial establishment of paternity and child support, enforcements for failure to pay court-ordered child support, and modifications to existing child support orders. The Support Division also represents the State of Washington in collection actions on parents owing a duty of support.
