INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE CITY OF PORT ANGELES, WASHINGTON AND
CLALLAM COUNTY WASHINGTON

2014 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD

This Agreement is made and entered into this ^{4th} 21 day of May, 2014, by and between The COUNTY of Clallam, acting by and through its governing body, the Board of Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY of Port Angeles, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Clallam County, State of Washington, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority of Chapter 39.34 RCW; and

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this agreement: and

WHEREAS, the CITY agrees to expend the \$10,195 from the JAG award for the enhancement of the Joint Agency Firearms Simmunitions, and Active Shooter Training Program; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to so allocate the JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and CITY agree as follows:

Section 1.

CITY agrees to use \$10,195 for the Joint Agency Firearms, Simmunitions and Active Shooter Training to purchase two (2) Glock handgun conversion kits, four (4) Sig-Sauer handgun conversion kits, four (4) rifle conversion kits, safety equipment, marking and blank training rounds, and other conversion kits. CITY agrees to comply with all bid, purchasing, and procurement laws and regulations of the JAG program and the State of Washington.

This equipment will support the joint firearms and force options training efforts of the existing Port Angeles Police Department (PAPD) and the Clallam County Sheriff's Department (CCSO). PAPD and CCSO lead a group of local, tribal and federal firearms and force options trainers that meet regularly and work jointly.

The CITY will add this equipment to the PAPD inventory, but will make it available to the CCSO upon request.

Section 2.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against COUNTY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the Washington Tort Claims Act.

Section 3.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the Washington Tort Claims Act.

Section 4.

Each party to this agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

Section 5.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 6.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.
