SAMPLING INSTRUCTIONS

Nitrate samples must be less than 48 hours old when received at the lab.
 (Samples that do not meet the 48-hour time limit will not be tested).

1. Take the sample the same day you plan to submit the sample to Clallam County Courthouse drinking water lab for testing.
2. The samples should be taken as close to the source as possible.
 - a. *If there is an outdoor spigot or hose-bib this is the ideal sample source over in a home sink or tub as the goal is to learn if the well is providing potable water*
3. To collect the sample, remove any attachment from the water tap, such as hoses, filters, screens, or aerators.
4. Flush the pipes by running the cold water for about 5-10 minutes. *(10-20 Minutes if it has not been used often in the last month).*
5. Fill the sample bottle to the shoulder of the bottle.
6. ****Keep the sample cold.**
7. Fill in the information on the other side of this sheet. *(make sure to include the exact sample location and physical address).*
8. Bring the sample to the Clallam County Courthouse drinking water lab for testing within 24 hours.

****Nitrate samples must remain cold, 39°F (4°C) or below.****

They must be kept cold but not frozen after you take them and while you transport them. Use a cooler or baggie with ice to maintain proper temperature.
