AMENDMENT TO THE STATE CONSTITUTION**

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 4223

The legislature has proposed a constitutional amendment on increasing an exemption from the personal property tax.

MUNICIPAL AQUATIC CENTER
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS -
\$13,800,000

The City Council of the City of Port Angeles passed Ordinance #3254 concerning this bond proposition. This proposition would authorize the City to finance the City's acquisition, construction and equipping of a municipal aquatic center by issuing general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$13,800,000 maturing within twenty (20) years, and to repay such bonds by levying property taxes annually in excess of regular tax levies on all taxable property within the City, all as provided in Ordinance #3254.

ONE YEAR LEVY FOR OPERATION
AND MAINTENANCE OF POOL AND
OTHER FACILITIES, PROGRAMS AND
PROPERTIES

The Board of Commissioners of the Quillayute Valley Park & Recreation District adopted Resolution No. 2006-04 concerning voter approval for a one-year operation and maintenance levy. If approved, this proposition would authorize a one-year levy to fund the operaton and maintenance of the pool and other district facilities, programs and properties. In 2007, the District would collect approximately \$250,000 through a property tax of about 98¢ per \$1,000 assessed value, in order to provide funding for operations through 2008, all as provided in the resolution.
