Clallam County Canvassing Board Certification Report | December 7, 2018

On Nov. 29, 2018, Clallam County Elections received an application from candidate John Black for a requested manual recount of the District Court II race.

The recount and the Canvassing Board meetings related to it were open to the public and notice was given following the applicable provisions of chapter 42.30 RCW.

Preparing for the Recount

To prepare for the recount, the ballots for District Court II were withdrawn from their batches, which included ballots for Precincts 204, 212, 215, 252, 262, 269, 301 and 302. Teams worked in groups of two to go through the batches that were identified as containing ballots for District Court II. Once finished withdrawing ballots from a batch, the ballots were counted and given to the recorder. The recorder checked the total ballots found in the batch against a Card Inventory Report from the tabulation system as a quality control measure, to ensure that all applicable ballots had been withdrawn. The recorder also made sure that no batches that contained the District Court II race were missed.

After all District Court II ballots were withdrawn, the ballots were sorted into piles according to precinct. Ballots in each precinct pile were counted, and the total was then compared to the Abstract Report (Precinct Report) for the election.

No discrepancies were found in the count of ballots pulled for District Court II.

The Recount Process

Elections employees worked in teams of two to conduct the recount, and there was a single recorder to monitor and record results.

The steps included:

- The ballots were distributed by precinct among teams.
- Each team of two counted one precinct at a time. The team began by dividing the precinct approximately evenly between the two members, who then separated the ballots by positions for the race. Positions included John Black, Erik Rohrer, Write-ins, Undervotes, Overvotes, and Canvass. (Canvass was to indicate that the vote was unclear and would be brought to the Canvassing Board for decision.)
- The first team member then proceeded to check and count all ballots marked for each odd-numbered position, while the second team member checked and counted all ballots for the even-numbered positions. The totals for each of the positions were written on side 1 of a 2-sided tally sheet.

- The team then turned over the tally sheet, so that they had a blank form to use for a second count.
- The second team member then checked and counted all ballots marked for each odd-numbered position, while the first team member checked and counted all ballots for the even-numbered positions. The totals for each of the positions were written on the second side of the tally sheet.
- The tally sheet was then given to the recorder.
- The recorder checked both sides of the tally sheet to see if the counts were the same, and then compared the counts to the Final Abstract Report in order to confirm whether the hand count matched the machine count.
- The recorder then added up the precinct count for a total count for each position. Hand counts results by precinct and position were entered into the Tally and Certification of Manual Recount form, for presenting to the Canvassing Board.

Recount Outcome

After following the steps for the recount, no discrepancies were found. The manual count for each precinct exactly matched the machine count. Additionally, there were no ballots in which the voter's intent was unclear for sending to the Canvassing Board.
