

How to Vote




Use a dark colored pen to completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.

The Board of Directors of Sequim School District No. 323 adopted Resolution No. 02-2020/2021, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State of Washington:

Capital Levy to Improve School Facilities

The Board of Directors of Sequim School District No. 323 adopted Resolution No. 03B: 2020/2021, a proposition to finance improvements to school facilities. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District, to modernize roofing; replace heating systems; upgrade networks; make sewer and water connections; modernize classrooms, gym and café flooring; install voice, access control and video surveillance systems; and replace the track, and stadium restrooms:

Quillayute Valley School District No. 402 Proposition No. 1 Replacement Educational Programs and Operation Levy

The Board of Directors of Quillayute Valley School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 03-2020/21, concerning a proposition for a replacement levy for education. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State:

Hospital District 1

Clallam County Hospital District No. 1 Proposition No. 1 Emergency Medical Services Levy

The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 1 (Forks Community Hospital) adopted Resolution No. 2020-535 concerning a proposition authorizing an emergency medical care and services levy. This proposition would authorize the District to levy regular property taxes at the rate of 32 cents or less per \$1,000 of assessed value, beginning with taxes payable in 2022 and continuing in each year for six consecutive years, to provide funds for emergency medical care or emergency medical services in the district, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and related equipment, supplies, vehicles and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services, all as provided in Resolution No. 2020-535.
