- Plant with native plants


Follow up

We are here to help with those weeds that require
mandatory control

Federal Noxious Weed Act, which is similar to **Washington's weed law**. Landowners who fail to control Class A and Class B designate noxious weeds on their property may be subjected to monetary penalties and/or billed for the cost of control. No specific method of control is required; the landowner may chose any cultural, mechanical, chemical, or biological method that obtains the desired result.
