Worksite:	Various Clallam County parks, facilities and open spaces
Position Goal:	To assist staff in maintenance of parks, beaches, public spaces
Sample Activities:	Revegetation, pruning, care for landscape plants Removal of invasive plants such as broom, clematis, herb-robert, ivy Litter clean-up Raking and minor repair of trail surfaces Watering new plantings Monitoring user activities and providing information, reporting problems to park staff Reporting and/or repairing damaged fence lines, signs Monitoring plant/animal populations for surveys
Timeframe:	Length of commitment: minimum of one year preferred Schedule: by agreement with staff
Minimum Qualifications:	Willingness to work cooperatively and under direction of Parks staff Willingness to gain Parks staff approval before altering the landscape Willingness to interface with a diverse public in a positive manner Willingness to cooperate with and learn from group leader volunteers Willingness to get dirty and have fun
Desired Qualifications:	Familiarity with the selected park area Ability to identify trees, shrubs and herbs Ability to walk park trails and fence lines
Reports to:	Parks Volunteer Coordinator or site manager
