

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECTS PROPOSALS

CLALLAM COUNTY PARKS, FAIR, AND FACILITIES DEPARTMENT

1. Robin Hill Farm County Park (RHF):

Build turnpikes in SE corner of RHF on horse trails. There are portions of the trail that become wet, muddy. Work on mapping out areas where the turnpikes are to be constructed, solicit funding, gather volunteers, and build the turnpikes.

2. Robin Hill Farm Three-Phase Project:

Phase I. Identify significant trail landmarks or intersections within the park's trail system and place a marker at each landmark. Work with Department on what signifies a landmark/intersection and determine type of marker is to be used. Inventory trail landmarks/intersections, solicit funding, gather volunteers, and complete project.

Phase II. Update RHF map with labels of the landmarks/intersections and determine distances from one point to another on each portion of the trail system, with the finished product being an updated RHF brochure and map. Work with Parks Department to come up with data for updated park brochure. Measure/identify trail distances throughout park and provide the Parks Department with a complete and easily read summary report of the work.

Phase III. Plant identification signs on the trail system. The signs will be visible to pedestrians on the trails. Work with the Department on the type and size of signs to be used, type of post the sign is secured, and placement of the signs. Solicit funding for signs/posts, research the plants to be identified and where they're located within the park, gather volunteers, and install signs.

3. Dungeness Recreation Area (DRA):

Build new trail working from the DRA Master Plan. Assist the Department with the layout of the new trail(s), solicit funding, gather volunteers, and build the trail.

4. Quillayute River Park:

Build a pedestrian bridge on the trail from the parking lot to the river. There is a depression which remains wet throughout most of the year. The bridge would span over the low spot. Work with the Department on the design, solicit funding, gather volunteers, and build the bridge.

5. Rainshadow Disc Golf Park:

Purchase and install a bicycle rack. Work with Department on design and rack location. Solicit funding, gather volunteers, and install bicycle rack. Bicycle racks also can be installed at Robin Hill Farm County Park and Agnew Soccer Fields.

6. Rainshadow Disc Golf Park:

Purchase and install a Conex box (metal cargo container). Work with the Department on design, size, and installation location. Solicit funding, gather volunteers, level area, and install Conex box.

7. Freshwater Bay County Park:

Build a bird viewing platform at Smith Pond. A birding platform, similar to the Dungeness Landing viewing platform, would be built on the west end of the pond. Work with the Department on the design, solicit funding, gather volunteers, and construct the platform.

8. Camp David Jr.:

Build rock armoring wall along shoreline, near Log Cabin. Work with the Department on design and size of rock armoring. Solicit funding, solicit heavy equipment and operator, gather volunteers, and build rock wall.

Camp David Jr.:

Install flag pole at Qui-Si-Sana Lodge. Work with the Department on pole material and color. Solicit funding, gather volunteers, remove existing flag pole, and install new pole. Draft a Policy that outlines proper flag etiquette from purchase of flag, proper flag care, proper display, flag replacement and flag replacement.

9. Crescent Beach Cemetery:

Clean the grounds and headstones, locate/document grave locations, and research if cemetery should be included in the Washington State Register of Historical Places. Work with the Department on scope of the work. Solicit funding, gather volunteers, and perform work at site. Work may involve the Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation so contact and Tribal approval may be required.

10. Salt Creek Recreation Area (SCRA):

Develop historical trail for Camp Hayden at SCRA. Using historical documents, locate places within the park that were part of the Camp during WWII. Install markers along the trail route identifying each area. Work with the Department to determine trail route and sign parameters (size, type, material and color). Research Camp Hayden maps/literature to identify possible sites, walk the grounds to identify specific sites, solicit funding, gather volunteers, and install signs. Possible supportive project is to build a small kiosk at the "trailhead" to identify trail and have a map of the trail on the kiosk.

11. Music or Arts in the Park Day.

Solicit funding, grants, contact artists, schedule the event, gather volunteers, assist with the set-up/breakdown, and put on the community event.

12. Dungeness and Salt Creek Recreation Areas (DRA/SCRA):

Construct dish washing stations for campers at DRA/SCRA. Work with the Department and other Clallam County departments to determine the proper location, design, and materials. Solicit funding, talk to tent campers for suggestions, determine tools/equipment, collect materials, gather volunteers, get inspections, and perform tasks.

13. Other Idea Possibilities:

- a. Construct a Rain Garden
- b. Construct and install Bat Houses at Salt Creek Recreation Area and Rainshadow Disc Golf Park
- c. Renovate softball field at Salt Creek Recreation Area
- d. Provide wheelchairs for Fairgrounds
- e. Trail maintenance and improvements at Dungeness Recreation Area
- f. Other ideas

Completed Eagle Scout Projects:

1. Install four pet waste stations at four Clallam County Park beaches (Port Williams, Dungeness Landing, Salt Creek, and Pillar Point). Determine locations of stations; solicit funding for four stations, and install stations.

2. Map of Fairgrounds and kiosk to hold map. Solicit funds from a service organization, work with a graphic designer and park staff to design map, assist with locating a site(s) on the grounds, and build the kiosk(s).
Colby Rentas completed this project July 2016.
3. Build new cabinets and refurbish information board at Agnew Soccer Fields. Work with Department on designing and color choice of cabinets and information board, solicit funding for materials, and construct/paint new features.
Troop 1460, Michael Scott completed this project April 2017.
4. Build a double kiosk at the Rainshadow Disc Golf Park. The kiosk will hold the park rules, disc golf rules, course map, and space for announcements/notices. Solicit funds for building material, work with the Department on the design, and construct the kiosk with volunteer labor.
Troop 1498, Matthew Craig, completed this project April 2017.
5. Update the Robin Hill Farm map with labels of the landmarks/intersections and determine distances from one point to another on each portion of the trail system, with the finished product being an updated RHF brochure and map. Work with the Department to come up with data for updated park brochure. Measure/identify trail distances throughout park and provide the Department with a complete and easily read summary report of the work.

6. Plant identification signs on the trail system. The signs will be visible to pedestrians on the trails. Work with the Department on the type and size of signs to be used, type of post the sign is secured, and placement of the signs.
